Examination Policy for Class 11th Students

1. Passing Criteria:

- A. To pass Class 11th, students must secure a minimum of 33% marks in both theory and practical examinations separately for each subject in the overall compiled result.
- B. It is mandatory for students to secure at least 33% marks in each theory subject in annuals examination separately to pass.

2. Final Assessment:

The final assessment will be based on the combined marks obtained throughout the year, including:

- A. Unit Tests (UTs)
- B. Half-Yearly examinations
- C. Pre-Annual examinations
- D. Annual examinations

3. Compartment Policy:

- A. Following CBSE norms, students who fail in one subject will be given a compartment opportunity.
- B. No request for retake of the examination will be considered under any circumstances if the child fails to clear the compartment examination.
- C. All compartment examinations will be held on the same day after a gap of 15 days of intimation about the compartment in a subject.

4. Practical Examinations:

Practical examinations are compulsory, and absence on the scheduled date will not be considered for re-examination.

Additional Points:

- Attendance: Students with poor attendance may not be allowed to sit for examinations.
- Malpractice: Any form of malpractice or unfair means during examinations will lead to severe penalties.
- Result Compilation: The final result will be compiled based on the combined marks obtained throughout the year.
- Students are expected to adhere to the examination schedule and rules.
- Students must make sure to attend all examinations and submit all required documents on time.
- The school administration reserves the right to make changes to the examination policy as deemed necessary.
